- The deadline for our Early Action Program is November 15. Students are notified of their admission decisions by January 15 and if admitted, receive priority consideration for merit scholarships, as well as priority consideration for housing and orientation. The Theatre School and School of Music do not participate in this program.
- DePaul awards over \$5 million dollars in academic, service and talent scholarships to enrolling students. Application materials must be postmarked by November 15 for priority consideration for academic scholarships. Talent or service-based awards have a February 1 deadline.
- The Corporation for National and Community Service named DePaul to the President's Higher Education Community Service Honor Roll with Distinction for exemplary service and service to disadvantaged youth. Honorees were chosen based on a series of factors including scope and innovativeness of service projects, percentage of student participation in service activities, incentives for service and the extent to which the school offers academic service learning courses. DePaul's extensive service learning is coordinated through the Irwin W. Steans Center for Community-based Service Learning and Community Service Studies. More than 2,800 DePaul students took part in service learning programs during the past academic year, providing critical support to scores of social service agencies throughout the Chicago metropolitan area.

- With more than 3,000 students enrolled in its undergraduate and graduate programs, the College of Computing and Digital Media (CDM) - formerly the School of Computer Science, Telecommunications and Information Systems - is one of the largest colleges of its kind in the nation. The college has received numerous national honors in recent years, including being one of the inaugural six universities selected to participate in the Sony Pictures Imageworks IPAX program.
