Founded in 1895, Eastern Illinois University (EIU) is located in Charleston, 180 miles south of Chicago, 140 miles northeast of St. Louis, and 9 miles east of I-57. Amtrak has daily train service to this area.

Colleges within the university include: Business and Technology, Education, Health and Human Services, and Liberal Arts and Sciences.

The Honors Program is available to new freshman and transfer students. Honors freshman criteria for consideration is the upper 10% of the high school graduating class or a 3.5 cumulative unweighted GPA on a 4.0 scale and an ACT composite of 26 or higher, SAT of 1240 or higher. Transfer students with a minimum GPA of 3.50 will be considered for the Honors Program.

Governors State University (GSU) offers majors and courses to students at all levels, from beginning undergraduate through doctoral programs. GSU is also committed to serving community college graduates, transfer students, returning adults and commuting students as they pursue their education and career goals.

Students have several options for pursuing a bachelor's degree at GSU. They can apply to begin their degree program as a freshman, transfer to GSU after completing coursework at another institution, continue their education at GSU after a delay, or enroll in the Dual Degree Program. The Dual Degree Program enables students enrolled full time in one of GSU's 17 partner community colleges to complete their associate degree and enroll at GSU to complete their bachelor's degree.

GSU offers 34 bachelor's degree programs, with associated majors and minors, in liberal arts, sciences, education, business, and health sciences; 24 master's degree and 5 doctoral degree programs.

Freshmen

This classification is for students who are currently attending high school or have graduated from high school but never attended college or have less than 25 semester hours from a regionally accredited institution. Special consideration will be applied when considering military veteran, international student, home school student, and GED earner applicants.

Requirements-Applicants must:

- have graduated or will graduate from high school with a minimum 2.75 GPA on a 4.0 scale
- have earned a minimum ACT composite of 19 or SAT equivalent (minimum SAT
- score range of 980 when combining Critical Reading plus Math) must meet the minimum high school subject requirements of 4 years of English, 3 years of Math, 2 years of Lab Sciences, 2 years of Social Sciences, 2 years of Fine Arts or 2 years of a Foreign Language and 2 years of Elective Academic Units Applicants are required to submit official high school transcript(s) and official ACT or SAT score reports (if younger than 21 years old), or official GED. Final high school transcripts must be submitted after graduating or freshman applicants will be unable to begin courses.

*Freshman admits are required to participate in a unique learning community that requires full time attendance with coursework largely taking place between 8:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. Monday-Friday. All freshman are admitted for the fall and spring

Priority Application Deadline is November 1

For academic year 2019-2020, a minimum of 24 semester or 36 guarter hours with roi academic year 2019-2020, a minimum of 24 seriester of 36 quarter flours with a minimum GPA of 2.0 or an AA or AS degree from a regionally accredited institution and good standing at the last institution attended are required. Students not meeting the above criteria may petition for admission under certain circumstances. Specific majors have established selective criteria above the university minimum. Refer to the Governors State University Catalog for specific major criteria. GSU has rolling admission for most undergraduate programs. However, specific deadline dates for the fall, spring and summer semesters are published in the GSU Catalog.

Students graduating from high school seeking admission must satisfy the following course pattern requirements: 4 years of English, 3 years of social science, 3 years of mathematics, 3 years of science, and 2 years of electives (foreign language, music, art, or vocational education). SIU uses a holistic review process, which also considers ACT or SAT subscores, high school rank, improvements in high school GPA from year to year, letters of recommendation, participation in service or extracurricular activities and extenuating circumstances

Applicants may submit their applications and supporting documents as early as July 1 before their senior year with the priority deadline being December 1. Middle 50% test scores, grade point average, and high school percentile rank vary by program. The best qualified applicants will be offered admission as space permits.

The University of Illinois Springfield is one of three campuses of the University of Illinois. Today, the more than 5,000 students enrolled are a mix of traditional residential students and full- and part-time nontraditional students - those who have transferred to UIS from other institutions; returned to finish a degree; or who are seeking advanced degrees, second degrees, or professional programs. In October 1999, UIS reached a milestone in its history when the Illinois Board of Higher Education unanimously approved the campus' four-year baccalaureate program, Capital Scholars. This program enrolled its first class of freshmen in Fall 2001. UIS admitted its first class of general admission freshman in addition to Capital Scholars Honors Freshman group starting Fall 2006. Students can pursue any of 52 University of Illinois degree programs, including 31 bachelor's degree programs. The average class is 15, with a student/faculty ratio of 15:1.

UIS' beautiful and spacious 746-acre campus is located on the southeast side of the capital city, near Lake Springfield. The campus is easily accessible via Interstates 55 and 72. UIS opened its Student Union in the Spring of 2018 and it has since become the focal point of campus and student life and is the heart of the university campus. Our students led the drive to bring the Student Union to campus because they realized how much it would enhance life on campus. More than 1,100 students live on campus and are encouraged to participate in our over 100 student clubs and organizations. UIS competes in NCAA Division II men's baseball, basketball, cross country, golf, soccer, tennis, and track/field, and women's basketball, cross country, golf, soccer, softball, tennis, track/field, and volleyball.

Other applicants: Applicants with 30 or more semester hours and a cumulative grade-point average of 2.00 or higher on a 4.00 scale from any accredited institution of higher education who do not hold an associate degree may be admitted. Applicants who have college coursework but fewer than 30 hours must meet freshman admission requirements. UIS participates in the Illinois Articulation Initiative (IAI), a statewide agreement that allows transfer of the completed Illinois General Education Core Curriculum between participating institutions.

Letters of support will also be considered. To guarantee consideration for admissions as an incoming freshman through the Academic Success program, applicants should submit an application and supporting materials by February 1, 2019.

Applicants who have earned 24 or more semester hours of college work will be considered for admission on the basis of college performance only. College work must have at least a combined "C" average for all hours attempted from all institutions and be in good standing at the last college/university attended.

Applicants who have earned fewer than 24 semester hours must meet freshman admission standards, have at least a combined "C" average for all hours attempted from all institutions, and be in good standing at the last college/university attended.
