Students submitting an application by the February 1 Regular Notification deadline are notified of their admission decisions by March 15. The Theatre School and School of Music operate under different deadlines; please visit www.depaul.edu/admission for details. Early FAFSA priority filing date is Nov. 15, with financial aid awarding beginning mid-December for admitted students.
- DePaul University is "test-optional" for freshmen applying for fall. Students interested in this option are encouraged to talk to their admission counselor to get more information. In adopting a test-optional approach, DePaul seeks to further enhance our student-centered admission process.
- DePaul University is located on two main campuses within the city of Chicago. Students study at one of eight different colleges and can choose among over 300 academic programs. At the heart of each program is a liberal studies core curriculum, which allows students to explore a wide variety of academic interests.
