He also holds a Master's in Executive Leadership from Liberty University, and a doctorate in Healthcare Administration (Health Equity Concentration) from the Virginia University of Lynchburg.*

*Dr. Hollemon previously served as Dean of Inclusive Excellence and Chief Diversity Officer at Hampden-Sydney College. In this role, Mr. Hollemon is unapologetically committed to engaging in community work to increase access and success in higher education for students from minoritized backgrounds. Dr. Hollemon's research interest focuses on critical race theory in Higher Education, teaching culturally relevant pedagogy, and factors affecting the educational experiences and retention of minoritized student populations. Dr. Hollemon currently serves as the Director of Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion for the National Association for College Admission Counseling where he is tasked with identifying, addressing and accessing DEI priorities throughout the association.*

#### D7 - Capital 1

##### Latinx Excellence and Tomorrow's Leaders

In the United States, the Latinx population is rapidly growing, yet, in 2021, the Illinois Board of Higher Education reported that only 3,610 Latinxs were employed in Illinois public universities. Of the total of Latinx employed in Illinois public universities, 64% of Latinxs held support staff positions and only 6% of Latinx held administrative positions (i.e., academic professionals). The latter employment classification represents the segment of professionals in higher education that would most likely be active members and hold leadership roles in IACAC. Increasing the percentage Latinx administrators is vital to the support of students and the success of secondary and post-secondary institutions. The need to recruit, mentor, and inspire young Latinx talent is more important than ever. This session will consist of two parts: a panel featuring Latinx leaders of secondary, post-secondary, and community-based organizations on their professional journey in education and an interactive session where attendees will be able to meet and connect with each other.
