#### **Goals of the High School Visit:**



To provide information to high school students

To create a connection and personal experience for high school students

#### **Driving Question (this year) in reflection to goal of the visit:**

- Are students informed about colleges?
- Have they participated in the many virtual events that have been offered?
  - Strivescan College Exploration Week (month), college presentations, webinars,
     3rd party (vendor) virtual tours such as YouVisit, Campus Tours, Etc.
- How do we create the connection and personal experience?

## 3 High School Frameworks emerging (panelists will be sharing different models)

- 1. All in-school (seems to be more the smaller, private/independent schools)
- 2. All remote/enriched elearning
- 3. Hybrid some students in some at home
- 4. A MIXTURE OF ALL THE ABOVE!

All can and will be circumvented by changes in pandemic and state regulations.





#### fair to say Virtual High School Visits

#### How are they organized?

- Reps call to schedule? Create the Zoom link?
  - Do high schools have restrictions on whether the online link (e.g. Zoom) must be created by the high school?
  - Does the high school rep need to sit in on the virtual visit? Probably a lot for a counselor to do, especially if these are after hours

#### When are they held?

- During the school day? After school hours?
  - If the high school is in synchronous learning sessions, how does the College Resource Center "pull " a student out of that session to attend a virtual visit? (I easily and understandably see a teacher being concerned about this)

#### Breadth of Visit:

- If visits are just another virtual presentation, then do we (high schools) just connect our students to reps to talk at their convenience?
  - If informational, then students can attend regularly offered virtual programs and not have the "high school visit"
  - Rising seniors' interest in colleges seems to be down, colleges think they are waiting to hear how they can visit, talk to a rep, etc. BUT are they still informed?
- If personal connection, then need perhaps college offers personal chats



### Possible Collaborations with Colleges:


- How do we encourage students to reach out directly to admission reps with appropriate questions?
- How do we teach students that reps are real, friendly, accessible people?
- How to get on a college's mailing list, or find your rep's contact info
- How to demonstrate interest
- Video on how to write a "professional" email with questions, and when it's appropriate to do so
- List of questions students might ask during a virtual visit
- Specialized topics: essays, virtual campus visits, financial aid, scholarship applications, what else?










## **Prospect High School**

- We plan to offer virtual rep visits for District 214 students
  - College reps will schedule through RepVisits in each of the six high schools and provide the link to their virtual visit
  - A master list of scheduled visits to each D214 high school will be compiled and shared with other schools
  - PHS available visit times: 8:30-9:00 a.m. and 9:00-9:30 a.m.daily during zero hour classes
  - CCC Assistant will "greet" rep at beginning of virtual visit
  - We will advertise both D214 virtual visits and IACAC/StriveScan visits

Email to all juniors and seniors encouraging them to submit admissions inquiry online forms for all colleges of interest to get on their mailing lists





## Libertyville High School

- Will start the year with remote learning (eSchool)
- Plan to offer virtual visits for LHS students
  - Most likely will use Naviance RepVisits to schedule
  - Working on times that work well with our eSchool schedule,
     which is now a modified block, with longer class times
  - Anticipate these virtual visits will be outside the normal school day
- Open to collaborating with other area high schools with similar demographics, including our other district HS, Vernon Hills
- Seniors will be encouraged to reach out individually to college reps for online questions.
  - Plan to create a video that instructs them on how to write a professional email and talk online with reps)

### Homewood-Flossmoor High School

- Administration (with the help of the Union & community), decided to begin the year remotely
  - Teachers/staff will be in attendance 5 days
    - Modified Block M-Th, Fr will be Student Work Day/Student Services
       Day
- Working on what the high school visit will look like
  - Have designated time from M-Th, beginning at 2:30 and Fridays, from 8:30am until 2pm
  - Anticipate utilizing RepVisits for signing up for visits
  - Also anticipate visits being outside the normal school hours
- Will encourage Seniors to fill out any online inquiry form for the colleges they're interested in, as well as contact the individual admissions rep with questions

### Remote Online Schedule

- Synchronous learning will take place 4 days per week.
- Staff will begin class with synchronous instruction and incorporate a variety of instructional strategies to engage students in the learning.
- Time is built in for student academic and social emotional support.

Sessions will run from 12:00 PM-12:50 PM Monday through Thursday

Friday presentations will be 11:30 AM-12:20 PM and 12:30 PM-12:0 PM There are 9 spots available for CARR members in each session Individual admission presentations will be 5 minutes and will include Q & A through the Zoom chat feature

Registration will be available through SignUp Genius starting August 10





### **CARR Virtual Visits**

- Gives students an opportunity to learn about multiple colleges of interest
- Similar to a lunch room visit
  - Each session will last 50 minutes (M-Th, 12:00-12:50, Fr 11:30-12:20 & 12:30-1:20)
  - Each session will consist of a max of 9 colleges
    - Each college will get 5 minutes to present
    - Students will ask questions via Zoom chat
    - May have time left over for Q&A
  - Students will need to pre-register (max of 90 students) through SignUp Genius



### You DON'T Have Mail

- Pre-COVID: Legal challenge of ACT/SAT licensing minor's contact information to colleges created an opt-in process.
  - o Think: who is least likely to opt-in?
- COVID: Students haven't been able to take the ACT/SAT
- We don't know who students are like we have in the past
  - Encourage students to reach out to colleges to get on mailing lists

### **Campus Visits**

- Many large universities are closing all on-campus visit tours
  - Concerned about setting social-distancing capacity limits being ignored.
- Regional and small colleges are still planning to host daily visits but no large campus visit programs.
- Large campus visit programs are typically efficient ways for large numbers students to learn about colleges.
  - If they are cancelled/limited, how does the demand for seeking information shift?
    - Virtual School Visits
    - Virtual Information Sessions
    - One-on-One Counseling visits
- Admissions Counselors should prepare for a notable shift in work
  - Timing of work may change
  - Are you adequately staffed to respond to shifting student inquiries?
    - Prepare for budgets to take a hit (10-20%?)

# What You Might Expect from Colleges & How You Can Help

For Students - More flexibility in programming and personal connection!

- Due to less travel, we are more accessible and can respond more quickly
- More unique or specialized ways to connect with campus (current students, alumni, academic departments and campus resources)
- Enhanced virtual campus views, images and virtual tours on website
- Increased social media presence
- Importance of completing a college inquiry form online
- General College Knowledge sessions to learn more about best practices and the college search process.
- Supportive partners in college search process.







# What You Might Expect from Colleges & How You Can Help

#### For School Counselors

- Available for traditional virtual high school visits and classroom visits
- Likely more available for daytime or evening parent/student or teacher workshops (no travel time)
- Promotion of college/university campus visit and virtual visit sites
- College daily processes and procedures should stay similar even with remote work
- Increased communication updates from colleges as situations change.
- Encouraging the promotion of IACAC/StriveScan Programming
- Emphasizing the importance of completing a college inquiry form online

### **How To Make The HSV Most Effective**

- The novelty of virtual visits has worn off, so prepare to make it fun
- Be prepared to improvise for time
- Using polls to bring the students in and keep them engaged every few minutes
- Power points that can be recorded, shared, and reviewed will help
- For bigger HSV's having colleagues help with chat
- Students perspective at the end if time (interns and ambassadors)
- If high schools visits are at 3:30 why not send to our Admission Presentation at the same time?
- Using HSV for addressing new deadlines
- Addressing new test optional policies
- Connecting to students in a new way
